Cooking Equipment

- $\hfill\square$ Keep appliances and stove tops clean
- $\hfill\square$ Wear tight-fitting sleeves while cooking
- $\hfill\square$ Keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen
- $\hfill\square$ Never leave a stove unattended when cooking
- $\hfill\square$ Turn off heat source if there is a fire
- $\hfill\square$ Apply baking soda or place a lid on pan fires
- \Box Never use water for a grease fire

Candles

- \Box Use sturdy metal, ceramic or glass holders
- $\hfill\square$ Extinguish candles when you go to sleep or leave the house
- \Box Keep burning candles away from flammable items
- \Box Keep candle wicks trimmed
- $\hfill\square$ Never set a candle on a combustible surface
- \Box Use flashlights for power outages

Electrical Wiring

- $\hfill\square$ Check wiring on appliances
- $\hfill\square$ Replace old and worn-out cords
- \Box Keep away from wet areas

Smoking, Lighters and Matches

- $\hfill\square$ Smoke outside
- \Box Keep out of the reach of children
- $\hfill\square$ Don't leave unattended
- \Box Make sure extinguished before discarding

Fire Safety Checklist

- □ Underwriters Laboratory (UL) approved
- □ Check & read manufacturers guidelines
- □ Check out local building codes
- □ Fire extinguisher
- □ Smoke/Carbon Monoxide detector
- □ Inspect regularly
- □ Regular maintenance and cleaning

Wood Stove Safety Checklist

- \Box 36" clearance from combustible surfaces
- \Box Chimney flue should be lined and in good condition
- \Box Vents should be made up of heavy gauge stovepipe
- $\hfill \hfill \hfill$
- $\hfill\square$ Use seasoned wood to burn
- $\hfill\square$ Burn small hot fires
- \Box Use clean newspaper and kindling to start fire
- \Box Do not use flammable substances or trash to start fires
- □ Dispose of ashes in non-combustible containers

Pellet Stove Safety

- $\hfill\square$ Have the unit professionally installed
- \Box Avoid buying a first generation stove

Fireplace Safety

- \Box Install a removable cap on the chimney
- □ Avoid using flammable liquids or garbage to start a fire
- □ Clean out all flammable materials near the fireplace
- \Box Use seasoned wood to burn
- □ Use non-combustible containers to remove ashes
- □ Never leave a burning fire unattended

- □ All combustible materials must be three feet or more away from heat source
- □ Keep pets/kids away from heat sources
- □ Wear tight fitting clothing
- □ Proper ventilation
- □ Develop a fire safety plan

Kerosene Heaters

- \Box Use proper fuel
- $\hfill \Box$ Do not overfill
- \Box Refuel heater outside after it has cooled
- \Box Store kerosene outside
- \Box Properly ventilate the heater
- □ Never leave the heater unattended

Space Heaters

- \Box Purchase with automatic shut-off feature
- □ Turn off at night or when leaving
- □ Do not use extension cords
- □ Place the space heater on a firm and stable surface
- □ Properly ventilate
- □ Never leave the heater unattended
